



BETHEL MISSION SCHOOL, KISHANGANJ

Annual Report – 2023-24

1. INTRODUCTION

It is a great honor to produce the annual report of the various activities conducted at Bethel Mission School, Kishanganj, during the academic session 2023- 24. The school is affiliated with the CBSE Board for class XII. In this session, the school emphasized various activities to improve the quality of education among all the students. Active participation is very important not only in education but also in cultural and social fields. So the school planned a bunch of co- curricular activities. Throughout the year, the students actively participated in debates, various sports competitions, cultural festivals, and volunteer activities. These activities helped the students develop diverse skills and readiness to face future opportunities and challenges.

2. TEACHERS ORIENTATION PROGRAM

The academic session of 2023 -24 commenced on April 4th in the school auditorium with teacher orientation program focused on fostering strong teamwork among the newly appointed teachers. The new teachers were introduced to the old teachers in the program, where they were encouraged to collaborate and support each other throughout the academic year. The orientation also included workshops on effective teaching strategies and classroom management techniques to ensure a successful start to the school year. The teachers shared their teaching experiences, discussed their educational philosophies, and presented their professional backgrounds, building a strong sense of unity and understanding among them. The principal of Bethel Mission School formally announced the names of the new class teachers, highlighting their roles and responsibilities, symbolizing the start of their journey at the school and emphasizing the school's commitment to supporting their growth and development.

3. NEW SESSION STARTS

Immediately following the teacher orientation program, our school commenced its new session on April 5, 2023. The new class teachers took the attendance, calling each student by name and Roll number. During the new session, many new children had positive experiences during their first day at school. Teachers introduced themselves to the new classes, and the students, in turn, introduced themselves to each other. On the first day of school, most teachers provided valuable advice on achieving academic success and creating a positive learning environment.

4. SELECTION OF MONITORS AND SCHOOL PUPIL LEADER

On May 6, 2023, the new monitors from classes I to XI were selected by the class teachers to maintain discipline and other disciplinary work. The monitors were assigned the following tasks: - Writing the date, day, subject, and period

- Recording the number of present and absent students
- Maintaining the cleanliness of the classroom.

5. FIT INDIA

Two students, Prince Kumar from class 9 and Alisha Fatima from class 7, participated in the preliminary round of the Fit India Quiz 2023. During the preliminary test, Prince Kumar secured the 4th position, while Alisha Fatima secured the 8th position. In 2023, a total of 16,702 schools from 702 districts nationwide participated in the preliminary exam of the Fit India Quiz, organized by the state in April. Although they performed admirably, they fell short of their expectations. The principal of Bethel Mission School motivated them to persevere in their efforts to achieve success in the future.



6. XTH BOARD EXAM RESULT

In the academic year 2022 – 2023, 106 students took the 10th board exam, in which 105 students passed. Jisan Shahid placed second with 92%, followed by Abu Arsalan in third place with 89.8% and Aditya Kumar Jyoti, the class topper, with 93%.

7. XIITH BOARD EXAM RESULT

The 12th board test was taken by 62 pupils in total, 56 of them passed. With 88% arts student Nikhil Kumar Jha topped the class; science student Karan Kumar came in second with 85%; and science student Kaushiki Joardar came in third with 82%.

8. CYCLE DAY CELEBRATIONS



Like all other activities, our school, Bethel Mission School, Uttarpalli, and Kishanganj also celebrated Cycle Day on June 3, 2023 to encourage the students of the present generation, who are mostly addicted to different indoor games on mobile devices, that make their lethargic and aimless. Excessive indulgence in indoor games on mobile devices can negatively impact students' physical health and mental well – being.

Cycle Day in school encourages the use of bicycles as a means of sustainable development among the students. It strengthens education, including physical education for children and young adults, while promoting a healthy and active lifestyle. Additionally, it helps reduced carbon emissions and traffic congestion around the school premises.



9. SCHOOL REOPENS WITH PROJECT SUBMISSION AFTER SUMMER BREAK

During the summer break, several projects and assignments were given to the students of various grade levels to keep them engaged and learning during their time off from school. Like every year, this year we also celebrated 77th Independence Day with unprecedented patriotic fervor. The gamut of celebration activities held on the campus consisted of special morning assembly. The entire school assembled at the ground. Our honorable principal, A. Kavitha Juliana hoisted the Tricolor followed by singing the national anthem and national song echoed in the entire campus. After hoisting the national flag, the students from different classes delivered speech in English, Hindi and Urdu on the importance of Independence Day. The school choir performed several patriotic songs and students
